We also earnestly pray that with the help of sagely guidance and boundless protection, all living
 beings may awaken to their buddha nature and world peace may be achieved.

Notes

1. After the second paragraph that begins “Here, today, members,” if reciting posthumous names, add the following:
“We reverently pray that
[*Read posthumous names out*]
may delight in the taste of the Dharma through the sutra recitation of this memorial service.”
2. As for the Special Words to Transfer Merit, refer to the examples in the appendix.
3. “Incense offering” can be performed by the sutra recitation leader after the Special Words to Transfer Merit are stated.
